

ENIWETOK



LAT. 11° 20' N LONG. 162° 20' E

Eniwetok is a typical coral atoll. The inter water is perfectly flat and looks much like a small lake. The cargo at Eniwetok consisted solely of used generators and diesel engines to be back loaded. These were placed on a barge and towed to the ship. From the barge they were loaded aboard the KUKUI and secured for sea.

Eniwetok was probably the nicest isolated Loran Station that the ship stopped at. The diving was fantastic and the scuba club went wild. The ship's party and cook out was held at the club on the island. A softball game followed the party with the ships crew losing the first game of "Mountain Ball" to the island team but redeeming themselves by winning the second game of "Fast Pitch."

All in all the stop at Eniwetok was thoroughly enjoyable but after five months away from home the crew was itchy to get underway again for KURE ISLAND and our second stop from Honolulu.
