Radiomen are the voice and ears of the ship. They are responsible for all radio communications; teletype, voice and code. Generally communications are conducted by teletype on the ship to shore circuits but at times it is necessary to go back to the old standby — dits and dahs.

Radiomen also receive weather maps by facsimile and weather information from shore stations. In an effort to keep the ship's complement up-to-date on the news we also publish a newspaper. An additional duty of radiomen is the operation of the ship's post office.
