



Resupplying Hallett Station

Located approximately 450 miles north of McMurdo Station on a peninsula which is a part of Cape Adair is Hallett Station. The station is only manned during the summer months and serves as a communications relay center for air traffic between McMurdo and Christchurch.

Because of her location, Hallett can only be supplied by ship. In this connection, **Westwind** made several trips to Hallett. In addition, as part of an expedition to obtain seals for scientific research, **Westwind** obtained a rare Ross Island Seal from the penguin rookery at Hallett.

Our last trip to Hallett was made in late February and here, on February 20th, **Westwind** said her final goodbye to Antarctica and commenced her long journey northward to Baltimore and home.
